

TV credits include Blue Bloods (CBS); Emergence (ABC); and The Blacklist (NBC). Before doing conservatory study at Michael Howard Studios, Christopher received his BBA in Finance at Howard University in Washington, DC. He credits his passion for acting to a lifelong love of helping and teaching others through storytelling. A NYC-based actor who proudly hails from Philadelphia, PA, Christopher currently resides in the Crown Heights section of Brooklyn.

CHARLIE CLARK (Peter/Ensemble) returns to TheatreSquared, where he has previously been seen as Tiny Tim in A Christmas Carol (2021 and 2022). Charlie recently appeared as Milkman in Down Home in the Arkansas (Vandergriff Elementary). His credits also include several local theatre camp productions at Arts Live and Fayetteville Parks & Rec. Charlie is in 4th Grade at Vandergriff Elementary School and enjoys sports, piano, Cub Scouts, and theatre.

LYDIA DYE (Tiny Tim) makes her TheatreSquared debut. This is her first on-stage production. She has attended several acting classes at TheatreSquared and Arts Live Theatre. She takes voice lessons at School of Rock-Fayetteville and is a second grader at Vandergriff Elementary.

YETUNDE FELIX-UKWU (Librarian/Mrs. Cratchit) makes her TheatreSquared debut. Selected credits include Voice 4 in Scarfoot Lives (Arena Stage); Fayola in Nollywood Dreams (Roundhouse Theatre); Ann in Babel (Unicorn Theatre); and Mrs. Cratchit in A Christmas Carol (Kansas City Repertory Theatre). FELICITY SMITH (Martha/Ensemble) makes her TheatreSquared debut. She is currently a sixth-grader at McNair Middle School in Fayetteville, where she has acted in The Wizard of Oz (Scarecrow), Alice in Wonderland, and Humor Games (a spin on Hunger Games). She studies dance at Elite Dance Studios, where she is a member of the competitive performance company.

TATIANA WATTS (Martha/Ensemble) returns to TheatreSquared, where she previously appeared as an understudy and Martha/Ensemble in the 2021 production of A Christmas Carol. Born and raised in Fort Smith, Arkansas—a place that has shaped her love for the arts—Tatiana is a passionate and dedicated actress with a love for the stage. From an early age she discovered her passion for acting, and her dedication to the craft and ability to bring characters to life with authenticity and grace has only deepened over the vears. As Tatiana steps back into the enchanting world of A Christmas Carol, portraying roles such as Fan, Sledding Child, Mary, Fezziwig Girl One, Belle's Daughter, Poor Niece, and Martha, she invites the audience to join her on a magical journey through this timeless tale.

DEXTER J. SINGLETON (Director) most recently directed Detroit '67 at TheatreSquared. He is a director, producer, activist, and educator from Detroit, MI. He is currently the Director of New Play Development at TheatreSquared and the Executive Artistic Director of Collective Consciousness Theatre (CCT), a multicultural theatre for social justice in New Haven, CT. Since 2007, Collective Consciousness Theatre has reached thousands of youth and adults with plays and workshops across the U.S. and Europe. They have produced the work of playwrights Dominique Morisseau, İdris Goodwin, Jackie Sibblies Drury, Katori Hall, and many others. As a director, Dexter's work has been seen at TheatreSquared, Pittsburgh Public Theatre, San Diego Repertory Theatre, Playhouse on Park, Connecticut Repertory Theatre, University of Michigan, University of Arkansas, Long Wharf Theatre, and many others. Recent credits include

Blood At The Root, Kill Move Paradise, Sweat, Skeleton Crew, North of Forbes, Baton, The Mountaintop, and Topdog/ Underdog. He is a member of the Artistic Ensemble at Long Wharf Theatre and a Part Time Lecturer in Directing at Yale University.He was recently awarded the 2021 BroadwayWorld Regional Award for Best Director of a Streaming Production for his work on Kill Move Paradise. He is also the recipient of the 2019 Artistic Excellence Award from the State of Connecticut and Distinguished Director of a Play for Black Book from The Kennedy Center/American College Theatre Festival.

AMY HERZBERG (Playwright/Originating Director) is associate artistic director and a co-founder of TheatreSquared and distinguished professor of theatre at the University of Arkansas, where she is the head of the MFA acting program. Credits include La Jolla Playhouse, George Street Playhouse, Alabama Shakespeare Festival Southern Writers' Project, Stages Repertory Theater, Valle Christi International Theatre Festival, English Theatre Berlin, and San Diego Repertory Theatre, where she was in the resident acting company for four years. For TheatreSquared, she has directed Stones in His Pockets, It Came From Outer Space, Shakespeare in Love, Once, Fun Home, Great Expectations, Good People, Amadeus, The Last Five Years, 'Twas the Night, Moonlight and Magnolias, Bad Dates, Next to Normal, and One Man, Two Guvnors. She has appeared in several T2 productions, including the world premieres of The Spiritualist and My Father's War, a play about her father's experiences in WWII. She has received numerous honors for her work, including the Kennedy Center's ACTF National Acting Teacher Fellowship, U of A's Charles and Nadine Baum Teaching Award, Fulbright College Master Teacher Award, Arkansas Arts Council Individual Artist Fellowship for Directing, and, along with her husband, the Governor's Arts Award. She has been recognized as one of 25 visionary Arkansans by the Arkansas Times, honoring Arkansans whose ideas have had a transformative impact on life in Arkansas. She holds an MFA in acting from Cal Arts, with additional training from American Conservatory Theatre and The Actors Center in New York.

MARTIN ANDREW (Scenic Designer) returns to TheatreSquared after creating the scenic design for Matilda and A Christmas Carol (2019, 2020, 2022). Other credits include: The Invisible Hand, The Fantasticks, and An Iliad (Kansas City Rep); Father Comes Home from the Wars, Detroit, and The Norman Conquests (Southern Rep); Port Authority (Writers Theatre); Proof (Court Theatre); Gypsy (Drury Lane Theatre); The Glass Menagerie (Steppenwolf Theatre / LAByrinth

Theatre Co.); Edge of Our Bodies (59E59); and Hedda Gabler (TUTA Theatre Chicago). Television credits include: Super Bowl XLVII (CBS), News & Weather Studio.

RUBY KEMPH (Costume Designer) is the Costume Director at TheatreSquared, where she has managed the costume shop and designed costumes for 40+ productions since 2008, including Shakespeare in Love, Around the World in 80 Days, Amadeus, and All the Way. NYC design credits include The Rivals (Ampersand Theatre) and Garage (Dive Theatre). She has built costumes for many Broadway productions, including The Phantom of the Opera, The Drowsy Chaperone, and Anything Goes, as well as films such as Mirror, Mirror and The Sisterhood of the Traveling Pants 2. She holds an MFA in costume design and technology from the University of Arkansas.

MEGAN REILLY (Original Lighting Designer) returns to TheatreSquared having recently designed lights for Matilda, Ann, and A Christmas Carol (2019-2022) and projections for 10,000 Balconies. A lighting and media designer based in Madison, WI, her Minneapolis credits include: immersive design for Cabal (Walking Shadow Theatre Company); projections for Orange and Hooded or Being Black for Dummies (Mixed Blood Theatre) and Buyer & Cellar (Hennepin Theatre Company); lighting for While You Were Out (Red Eye Theatre) and The Sparrow (Live Action Set). In Texas: Roald Dahl's Willy Wonka and Dragons Love Tacos (Magik Theatre); several shows for Street Corner Arts, Penfold Theatre Company, Salvage Vanguard, Trouble Puppet, Glass Half Full, Hidden Room (all in Austin); Mary Poppins and Beauty and the Beast (Prescott Park Arts Festival); and Jesus Christ Superstar (Firehouse Center for the Arts). Internationally she has designed for Collaborative Artists Company in Dublin and the Edinburgh Fringe Festival. She teaches lighting design at the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

ZACK MCJUNKINS (Co-Lighting Designer) makes his TheatreSquared design debut. He has worked alongside TheatreSquared as Production Overhire since 2020 and came on board as the full-time Lighting Supervisor in 2023. His past lighting design credits include The Ballad of Sweeney Todd for Arts One Presents, The Tempest and Much Ado About Nothing for Arkansas Shakespeare Theatre, and This Bitch! and The Wolves at the University of Arkansas.

TOMMY ROSATI (Original Sound Designer) returns to TheatreSquared, where he designed A Christmas Carol in 2019, 2021 and 2022. Off-Broadway credits: audio assistant on Allegro (Classic Stage

Company); sound engineer on Sex Tips for Straight Women from a Gay Man (777 Theatre). International tour credits: audio engineer on Angelina Ballerina and Pinkalicious. Regional credits: sound designer for Ghost Writer and Cowgirls and stage manager for Shake Rattle and Roll (Florida Studio Theatre). He serves as the resident sound designer at Park Playhouse in Albany, NY, and at Collective Consciousness Theatre in New Haven, CT. He teaches technical theatre at the Regional Center for the Arts, a performing arts high school in Connecticut.

CAMERON M. GRIFFITHS (Co-Sound Designer) returns to TheatreSquared, where he was the sound designer for Chicken and Biscuits. Credits include Disney's When You Wish and A Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder (Tuacahn Center for the Arts); The Lady Demands Satisfaction, Native Gardens, It's A Wonderful Life: A Live Radio Play, and St. Joan (Gulfshore Playhouse).

(Co-Choreographers) return to TheatreSquared. Sisters and proud owners and instructors at Elite Dance Studios for 26 years. They have had many partnerships with the TheatreSquared teaching staff. Other community collaborations within NWA include the Lyric Theatre, Walton Arts Center, the University of Arkansas, and many area high schools and theatre groups. They are proud of their many theatre students out shining on stages in their community.

EMELY ZEPEDA (Production Stage Manager) is the resident production stage manager at TheatreSquared, where she has stage managed The Band's Visit, Dial M for Murder, Violet, Sanctuary City, Detroit '67, It Came From Outer Space, Miss You Like Hell, The Elaborate Entrance of Chad Deity, The Mountaintop, A Christmas Carol, Designing Women, and American Mariachi. She was previously the resident production stage manager with Brave New World Repertory Theatre in Brooklyn, NY, where she stage

managed Shakespeare on Stratford (2021 and 2019), The Hook, A View from the Bridge, The Plantation, and Ms. Julie, Asian Equities. Other credits: I Am My Own Wife (Long Wharf Theatre); Only Human (St. Clement's); Tech Support (59E59 Theaters); Till (New York Musical Festival); Zen AM and I Am Antigone (Theater for the New City); Hatefuck (WP Theater); Soft Butter (Ars Nova); Melt (High Line); Thunderbodies (Soho Repertory Theatre); Ann and Skeleton Crew (Dorset Theatre). She holds an MFA in stage management from Yale and a BA in Theatre Technical Design from Binghamton University.

BOB FORD (Artistic Director) is an award-winning playwright, novelist and musician who helped found TheatreSquared in 2005, and since then has co-produced 90 plays and musicals and facilitated the development of over 85 new works. Most recently, T2 featured his new play-in-progress, The Grove of Forgetting, in the 2023 Arkansas New Play Festival. With Amy Herzberg, he co-adapted two versions of A Christmas Carol for T2. T2 has produced several of his plays, including Fault, The Spiritualist, The Fall of the House (also Alabama Shakespeare Festival—Edgar Award nominee), Look Away, 'Twas the Night, and adaptations of Great Expectations, My Father's War, and It's a Wonderful Life. His critically acclaimed first novel, The Student Conductor, was a Barnes & Noble Discover Great New Writers pick. He holds a MMus degree from Yale and MFAs in acting from Rutgers and in playwriting & screenwriting from the University of Texas at Austin.

SHANNON A. JONES (Executive Director) joined TheatreSquared in 2014, navigating roles from assistant stage manager to production stage manager to her current position at the helm. In her time at T2, she has managed, supported, and uplifted a multitude of artists, worked as a liaison with Crystal Bridges, facilitated donor and artist engagement, mentored emerging stage managers, and served as a member of the TRUE initiative / TRAIN cohort of NWA. She fostered the development of T2's DEIA goals, oversees the company's 100 employees, organizes the budgeting process, and manages the logistics for the annual Arkansas New Play Festival. She was recognized in the 2023 Northwest Arkansas Business Journal's Forty Under 40 class. Highlights of some of her behind-the-scenes work at T2 include Peter and the Starcatcher, The Champion, and The Legend of Georgia McBride, to name a few. As a Florida native and former freelance stage manager, she's worked at theatres spanning the east coast, from Florida to Maine. She holds a BFA in Stage Management from the University of Central Florida and is a member of Actors' Equity Association.
